

Dakota County Statewide Health Improvement Partnership (SHIP)

Cumulative Progress Report 2017 – 2025

SHIP Awarded Funds

SHIP Dakota County Public Health Department was awarded approx. \$782,852 each grant cycle from the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH).

Leveraged Funds

During each grant cycle, Dakota County's SHIP team secured additional funds by applying for non-MDH grants that align with SHIP's goals. The grants range in size from large developmental, cross-department projects (e.g. constructing pedestrian bridges) to smaller, more focused grants (e.g. creating a vegetable garden at a school).

Healthy Eating

- Increased opportunities for healthy eating or breastfeeding support at schools (7), worksites (11), community settings (8)
- Rapid Response Food Shelf Grants (10)
- Farmers Market Power of Produce (POP) launched engaging 173 youth and 100% of vendors

Active Living

- 2 cities created plans to support walking and biking
