

# Free Naloxone in Dakota County



Naloxone is used to rapidly reverse an opioid overdose, like from heroin, oxycodone or fentanyl. Anyone from the community can anonymously get a free kit at county locations.

## Dakota County offers naloxone kits and fentanyl test strips:

- **Nasal kit:** Includes directions and spray that is administered through the nose.
- **Intramuscular kit:** Includes directions, syringe and vial of naloxone. Injection is administered in the shoulder (like a flu shot) or into the front of the thigh.
- **Fentanyl test strips:** Test strips that can detect fentanyl in opioids and non-opioids.

*No insurance or personal information is needed.*

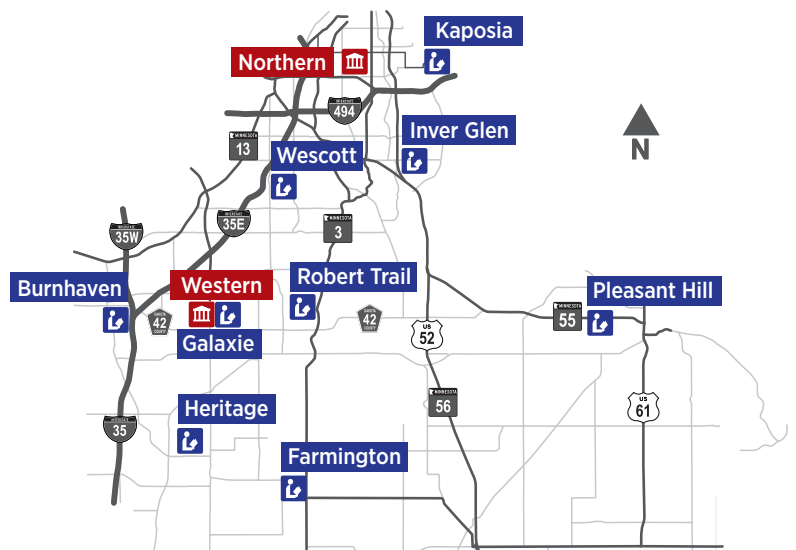
